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## FORMAT FOR SOCIAL CHANGE FIELD WORK PROPOSAL

### Your proposal must include:

- ✓ Your name, program, school email, and contact number
- ✓ Mentor's name, Organization/Affiliation, email, and contact number
- ✓ Proposed title
- ✓ Planned course:
  - FERS 3000
  - FERS 3001
  - FERS 3002
- ✓ **Should be no longer than 8 pages, double-spaced**
- ✓ submitted to SCFW Adjunct Faculty and Director of Field Education

### Criteria:

proposal should describe the project itself in narrative detail, indicating the following elements:

- ❖ **Engaged:** systemic or structural change for social equity and justice
- ❖ **Rooted:** in cultural wisdom, spiritual humility and social equity
- ❖ **Spiritual Practice:** integrating action and reflection
- ❖ **Potential Impact:** resilient change with the community most impacted
- ❖ **Accountability:** to named community
- ❖ **Vision:** how is your own transformational work embodied in your practice
- ❖ **Connected:** to broader strategies and communities for social change
- ❖ **Adaptive:** listening and learning incorporated into work
- ❖ **Collaboration:** strategic partnership, mutuality

## Suggested questions for narrative

Students have flexibility to propose area, scale, and form of social change work. Proposal must be for a significant social change work that will have a meaningful community impact and integrate spiritual practices.

- What approach(es) to social change are the basis for this work? Who/what other work is being done that is related to this proposal and how is this work distinct?
- What are your desired outcomes?
- How are power dynamics engaged in your social change work?
- How will you integrate spiritual practices in this social change field work?
- What skills do you have to engage this social change field work?
- What learning needs to you have to engage this social change field work?
- What accountability does this work have to the communities with whom you will be working?
- What form of demonstration, documentation presentation, or portfolio will best integrate this change work with your life experience, courses and program?
- How are your vision, spirituality and values embedded in this work?
- How many hours per week will you engage this specific social change work?
- What will be your weekly theological reflection practice?
- What are your priorities in this work and your process for prioritizing?
